### May Milk Production in California down 0.7 percent

Milk production during May totaled 3.64 billion pounds, down 0.7 percent from May 2022 and up 2.9 percent April 2023. The number of milk cows on farms in California was 1,719 thousand head, down 3,000 from May 2022 and down 1,000 from April 2023. Production per cow in California averaged 2,120 pounds, down 10 pounds from May 2022 and up 60 pounds from April 2023.


