KANSAS HOG INVENTORY DOWN 7%

MANHATTAN, Kan. March 30, 2022 - Kansas inventory of all hogs and pigs on March 1, 2022, was 1.85 million head, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. This was down 7% from March 1, 2021, and down 7% from December 1, 2021.

Breeding hog inventory, at 155,000 head, was down 9% from March 1, 2021, and down 6% from last quarter. **Market hog inventory**, at 1.70 million head, was down 7% from last year, and down 7% from last quarter.

The December 2021 - February 2022 Kansas pig crop, at 818,000 head, was down 7% from 2021. Sows farrowed during the period totaled 81,000 head, down 4% from last year. The average pigs saved per litter was 10.10 for the December - February period, compared to 10.50 last year.

Kansas hog producers intend to farrow 81,000 sows during the March - May 2022 quarter, down 8% from the actual farrowings during the same period a year ago. Intended farrowings for June - August 2022 are 78,000 sows, down 11% from the actual farrowings during the same period a year ago.
