

**Cattle and calves on feed** for the slaughter market in Minnesota feedlots with a capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 100,000 head on May 1, 2022, according to the latest USDA, National Agricultural Statistics Service – *Cattle on Feed* report. This was unchanged from April but down 9 percent from May 1, 2021.

**Placements** of cattle and calves in Minnesota feedlots with a capacity of 1,000 or more head during April totaled 14,000 head, down 7 percent from March but up 8 percent from last year. **Marketings** of fed cattle from Minnesota feedlots with a capacity of 1,000 or more head during April totaled 13,000 head, down 7 percent from March and down 24 percent from last year. **Other disappearance** totaled 1,000 head.

It excludes cattle being "backgrounded only" for later sale as feeders or later placement in another feedlot.

<sup>2</sup> Includes death loss, movement from feedlots to pasture, and shipments to other feedlots for further feedlots.


## UNITED STATES CATTLE ON FEED

Cattle and calves on feed for the slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 12.0 million head on May 1, 2022. The inventory was 2 percent above May 1, 2021. This is the highest May 1 inventory since the series began in 1996.

Placements in feedlots during April totaled 1.81 million head, 1 percent below 2021. Net placements were 1.76 million head. During April, placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 355,000 head, 600-699 pounds were 270,000 head, 700-799 pounds were 415,000 head, 800-899 pounds were 489,000 head, 900-999 pounds were 210,000 head, and 1,000 pounds and greater were 70,000 head.

Marketings of fed cattle during April totaled 1.89 million head, 2 percent below 2021.

Other disappearance totaled 54,000 head during April, 2 percent below 2021.
