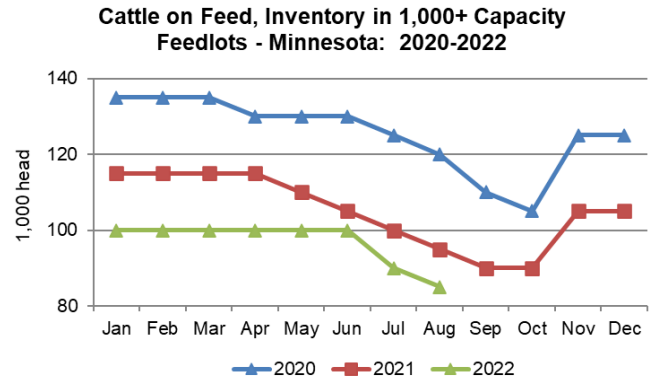

Cattle and calves on feed for the slaughter market in Minnesota feedlots with a capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 85,000 head on August 1, 2022, according to the latest USDA, National Agricultural Statistics Service – *Cattle on Feed* report. This was down 6 percent from July and down 11 percent from August 1, 2021.

Placements of cattle and calves in Minnesota feedlots with a capacity of 1,000 or more head during July totaled 10,000 head, unchanged from June but down 9 percent from last year. **Marketings** of fed cattle from Minnesota feedlots with a capacity of 1,000 or more head during July totaled 14,000 head, down 26 percent from June and down 7 percent from last year. **Other disappearance** totaled 1,000 head.

¹ Cattle on feed are steers and heifers being fed a ration of grain, silage, hay and/or protein supplement for slaughter market that are expected to produce a carcass that will grade select or better. It excludes cattle being "backgrounded only" for later sale as feeders or later placement in another feedlot.

² Includes death loss, movement from feedlots to pasture, and shipments to other feedlots for further feeding.

UNITED STATES CATTLE ON FEED

Cattle and calves on feed for the slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 11.2 million head on August 1, 2022. The inventory was 1 percent above August 1, 2021. This is the second highest August 1 inventory since the series began in 1996.

Placements in feedlots during July totaled 1.77 million head, 2 percent above 2021. Net placements were 1.71 million head. During July, placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 410,000 head, 600-699 pounds were 280,000 head, 700-799 pounds were 400,000 head, 800-899 pounds were 405,000 head, 900-999 pounds were 195,000 head, and 1,000 pounds and greater were 75,000 head.

Marketings of fed cattle during July totaled 1.83 million head, 4 percent below 2021.

Other disappearance totaled 56,000 head during July, 2 percent above 2021.
