#### June Milk Production in California down 1.8 percent from last June

Milk production during June totaled 3.36 billion pounds, down 1.8 percent from June 2023 and down 6.2 percent May 2024. The number of milk cows on farms in California was 1.71 million head, down 5,000 from June 2023 and unchanged from May 2024. Production per cow in California averaged 1,965 pounds, down 30 pounds from June 2023 and down 130 pounds from May 2024.


