New National Hemp Survey Releases Key Findings for New England

CONCORD, NH – The U.S Department of Agriculture’s National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) conducted the first-ever National Hemp Survey. The survey was sent to 20,500 producers to gather information on the acreage, yield, production, price, and value of hemp. The data will be used to assist producers, regulatory agencies, state governments, processors, and other key industry entities.

Key findings for New England states released in the report include:

Industrial hemp in the open:

- Connecticut - Planted area for all utilizations totaled 40 acres. Area harvested for all purposes in the open totaled 24 acres.
- Maine – Planted area for all utilizations totaled 50 acres. Area harvested for all purposes in the open totaled 35 acres.
- Massachusetts – Planted area for all utilizations totaled 80 acres. Area harvested for all purposes in the open totaled 68 acres.
- Vermont – Planted area for all utilizations totaled 1,100 acres. Area harvested for all purposes in the open totaled 1,080 acres.
