Released August 6, 2018

Good week for field work: New York averaged 5.5 days suitable for field work.

Temperatures ranged from 2 degrees below to 6 degrees above normal. Weekly precipitation ranged from 0 to 4.54 inches. Reporters noted low levels of rain continuing from last week. Some expressed concern over low crop weight from earlier weather conditions. Others reported that rain is helping growth of still unharvested crops. Relation to last year's and the five year average progress is a mixed bag with many commodities progressed further, others behind.

REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

Cayuga County; Colleen Cargile, Cayuga County FSA:

Producers are beginning to harvest oats. Reports thus far indicate that the oats are not weighing very much, probably because of the extremely hot and dry weather that we experienced for much of the spring and summer.

Delaware County; Mariane Kiraly, Cornell Cooperative Extension:

Heavy rains kept hay harvesting at a minimum last week.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties; Nathan R Herendeen:

Rains came but still short. Helped soybeans and late planted corn. Regrowth hay crop silage has been short for dairy farms and dry hay producers. Rains helped pasture and mixed hay fields. Received about 1 inch in most of the area on Aug 3. Still short of topsoil and subsoil moisture. Some August forage crop seedings are being made.

Livingston County; Dean R Pendergast:

Crops continue to advance well. Harvest of multiple veg crops within the county.

Ontario County; Joann Rogers, County Executive Director FSA:

Ontario County only received a trace of rain mid-week and then some spotty rains. So most of the county is still dry with warm temperatures. Hay, vegetable and fruit harvest continues with soybeans blooming and setting pods.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties; Kathy Mastellar, CED, Seneca/Schuyler FSA:

A nice week for forage harvest. Rain last week helped crops.
