## USDA forecasts 2022 New York corn and soybean crops

**ALBANY, NY ---** The USDA-NASS has released the crop production forecast for November, according to Donnie Fike, state statistician of the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS), New York Field Office. The latest survey, which was conducted during the last week of October and first week of November, included the following commodities:

**Corn:** Production is forecast at 80.3 million bushels, down 17% from 2021. Based on conditions as of November 1, yields are expected to average 156.0 bushels per acre, 11 bushels below the 2021 average. Area harvested for grain is forecast at 515 thousand acres, down 65 thousand acres from 2021.

**Soybean:** Production is forecast at 17.6 million bushels, up 4% from last year. Based on November 1 conditions, yields are expected to average a 51.0 bushels per acre, down 2 bushels from last year. Area for harvest is forecast at 345 thousand acres, up 25 thousand acres from last year.

Production forecasts are released on a monthly basis and do not reflect final production estimates. Fall harvests may change these estimates considerably. The next production forecast will be issued December 9, 2022.
