## SOUTH DAKOTA CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

**SIoux FALLS, S.D. November 12, 2024** - For the week ending November 10, 2024, there were 5.6 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 32% very short, 45% short, 23% adequate, and 0% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 29% very short, 43% short, 28% adequate, and 0% surplus.

**Field Crops Report:** Corn harvested was 94%, ahead of 84% last year and 79% for the five-year average.

Winter wheat condition rated 3% very poor, 26% poor, 43% fair, 24% good, and 4% excellent. Winter wheat emerged was 75%, behind 92% last year and 90% average.

Sorghum harvested was 94%, ahead of 85% last year and 86% average.

Sunflowers harvested was 83%, ahead of 66% last year and 71% average.

**Pasture and Range Report:** Pasture and range conditions rated 25% very poor, 27% poor, 30% fair, 18% good, and 0% excellent.
